Henry Steiner

Everyone who visits Hong Kong comes across Henry Steiner's work. The designer, who has lived here for 40 years, was responsible for the HSBC hexagon logo, the Hong Kong Jockey club motif and the Standard Charteredissued bank notes. He talks to MARK GRAHAM

What kept you here so long?

There is a buzz in Hong Kong. It bustles. It gets on with things. Despite our current anxieties, the buzz is still there. People are safe here. Chinese people don't drink to excess and there is an ingrained respect for property. You don't get pointless vandalism in the subway or the car antennae bent here.

Any special places?

Go to Sai Ying Poon, just west of Sheung Wan, to see a bit of how Hong Kong was in the 1970s. There is an Eastern Street, Western Street, First Street and Second Street from when

the Brits tried to bring some order. It is like an aquatic museum with various sea creatures of every kind and incense shops. The smell hits you: I find it redolent and charming. I often think that if I had a blind tourist friend I would take him there.

How about wining and dining?

Lan Kwai Fong is fun at night – dynamic and it is amazing to see so much activity and funny things. Last time I went there were different people selling those flashing items, magic wands and badges. For food, Michelle's at the Fringe is expensive but extremely dependable, in a very pleasant location. The Spring Deer in Tsim Sha Tsui is also fun and dependable.

Any other tips?

It is the obvious things in Hong Kong that are so much fun. The Star Ferry is a wonderful ride, similarly the Peak Tram and the Mid-Levels escalator that goes up through the residential areas of Soho. Sometimes tourists have the impression that the escalator goes up to the Peak; you see them standing wondering where they are. The tram of



course is also a stunning ride – it goes past shops, markets, crowds and activities.

Take a walk along Hollywood Road, from one shop to another, but be careful as there are some excellent counterfeits of antiques.

What feedback do you get?

People think that I get royalties from my designs. I wish! My response is that it is nice to be recognised. It is gratifying that the designs are not getting older, but getting better. They were built to last.

Any memories of old Hong Kong?

All the girls wore cheong-sams when I arrived. They were quite beautiful. I took the Star Ferry for quite some time and walking behind the cheong-sam was a lovely experience. It is not my field of design – I do branding and graphic design – but in terms of fashion around 1967 the cheong-sam disappeared and was replaced by western ready-to-wear clothing, in particular mini-skirts, high boots and pony tails.
